Notice is hereby given that the Oklahoma City Public Property Authority will receive electronic proposals at the Office of PFM Financial Advisors LLC, until 4:00:00 p.m. CST on the 14th day of January 2025, for the following:

RFP-OCPPA-020 REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR FINANCING THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW NBA ARENA IN OKLAHOMA CITY, OKLAHOMA.

The Oklahoma City Public Property Authority, the Contracting Entity, has partnered with their Municipal Advisor, PFM Financial Advisors LLC, to accept electronic proposals on their behalf for financing the construction of the new arena. Upon expiration of the proposal deadline, only those proposals timely received electronically through PFM Financial Advisors LLC shall be forwarded to the Contracting Entity for the Selection Committee to open and review. PFM Financial Advisors will not allow proposals to be submitted after the above-stated date and time. There will be no exceptions to this policy.

The Contracting Entity recommends that potential proposers become familiar with PFM Financial Advisors LLC's electronic proposal submission process in advance of submitting a proposal. There is no charge to the proposer for submitting an electronic proposal to the Contracting Entity through PFM Financial Advisors LLC. Instructions concerning response submission, addenda, and point of contact through PFM Financial Advisors LLC can be found in Section III. B. Questions and Additional Information. Proposals shall be made in accordance with the Notice to Proposers, Proposal Documents, Oklahoma Open Records Act and Confidential Information, and the proposal packet, which are a part of the electronic proposal packet. By submitting a proposal for services, the Proposer certifies that they, and any proposed subcontractors, are in compliance with 25 O.S. §1313 and participate in the Status Verification System. The Status Verification System is defined in 25 O.S. §1312 and includes but is not limited to the free Employment Verification Program (E-Verify) through the Department of Homeland Security and available at www.dhs.gov/E-Verify.

The Contracting Entity reserves the right to waive formalities, irregularities, and defects in any or all proposals except as otherwise required by law. The Contracting Entity reserves the right to reject any or all proposals; to reject a portion of any or all proposals; to negotiate and execute or to not negotiate or execute an Agreement with any Proposer; and to solicit new or different proposals.

All interested parties who submit proposals will be required to comply with all applicable Equal Employment Opportunity Regulations. The Trust will affirmatively ensure that Disadvantaged Business Enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit a proposal in response to this solicitation.

Sales Tax Revenue Financing

I. INTRODUCTION

The Oklahoma City Public Property Authority (the “OCPPA” or the “Issuer”) is issuing this Request For Proposals (“RFP”) to solicit responses/proposals, hereinafter referred to as a “Proposal,” from banks and investment banks regarding financing a New NBA Arena to be constructed in The City of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma (the “City”).

The OCPPA is a Trust of the City of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma (the “City”) established on August 15, 1961, with the City named as the beneficiary. The purpose of the OCPPA is generally to finance various municipal recreation improvements and services. The OCPPA consists of the Mayor and eight City Councilors. The City Manager serves as the General Manager, and the City Clerk as the secretary.

On December 12, 2023, the voters of the City approved a (1%) dedicated sales tax to fund the construction of the New NBA Arena, to be collected over a six-year period. Tax collections will begin on April 1, 2028, and end on March 31, 2034. The expectation is to fully pay off any outstanding debt by the end of the dedicated arena sales tax, which expires on March 31, 2034.

The financing process is expected to commence in Q2 of FY 2026.

Additional background information regarding the new arena may be found in the Request for Information, Oklahoma City New NBA Arena Financing Opportunities, dated August 15, 2024, attached as (Exhibit A)

II. PURPOSE OF REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL

The purpose of this RFP is to solicit financing proposals from commercial banks and investment banks (“Banks”) to provide funding for the construction of a New NBA Arena located in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Responses will be evaluated, and a commercial bank(s) and/or investment bank(s) will be selected to assist with financing the New NBA Arena. If necessary, a syndicate of investment banks will be constructed from those responding to the RFP and/or the City’s prequalified underwriting pool.

III. PROPOSAL SUBMITTAL INSTRUCTIONS

A. Electronic Proposals

The “Issuer” has partnered with their Municipal Advisor, PFM Financial Advisors LLC

("PFM"), to accept the electronic proposals on the Issuer's behalf to finance the construction of a new arena in The City of Oklahoma City. All proposals must be received through PFM's electronic proposal submittal process described in this document.

The deadline for proposal submission is **4:00:00 p.m. CST, January 14, 2025**, through PFM Financial Advisors LLC's electronic proposal submittal process. Any proposal received after **4:00:00 p.m. CST, January 14, 2025**, will be rejected and returned to the sender. The OCPPA reserves the right to issue addenda to extend beyond the original due date should it be determined to be in the best interest of the OCPPA. **Proposals received by PFM through their electronic proposal submittal process shall be the official proposal.**

B. Questions and Additional Information

Any inquiries, suggestions, or requests concerning clarification or solicitation for additional information shall be submitted through PFM's electronic proposal system no later than **December 5, 2024, at 12:00:00 p.m. CST.**

Answers to all questions not already addressed in the RFP will be provided in the form of an addenda.

IV. Financing Related Information

A. Security of Financing

The Debt will be a special, limited obligation of the Issuer payable solely from the Trust Estate pledged therefor under the Indenture securing the OCPA's Sales Tax Revenue Debt by and between the Issuer and BOKF, NA as trustee (the "Trustee"), secured by a (1%) dedicated sales tax to fund the construction of the New NBA Arena, approved by the voters on December 12, 2023, to be collected over a six-year period. Tax collections will begin on April 1, 2028, and end on March 31, 2034. In addition, the revenues from an accompanying (1%) Use Tax will be collected over the same six-year period as the dedicated sales tax and will be pledged as security for the OCPA's Sales Tax Revenue Debt. Although the accompanying Use Tax is pledged to repay the debt, the Dedicated Sales Tax Collections are expected to repay the debt.

No other City or Trust funds are pledged to the Oklahoma City Public Property Sales Tax Revenue Debt.

B. Private Placement / Bank Loan Status

If a proposal includes a Bank Note to be issued as a Private Placement obligation to be purchased by a financial institution, the purchaser of the Bank Note will be required to execute an Investment Letter, representing itself as an "accredited investor" pursuant to Rule 501 of Regulation D promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission. As such, the Bank Note will have limited assignability or transferability other than to another accredited investor. In essence, the purchaser is purchasing the Bank Note for his or her own account with the intent to hold the Bank Note to final maturity or early redemption.

The winning purchaser will be required to certify that they have a present intent to hold the Bank Note to maturity, earlier redemption, mandatory tender, or for its loan portfolio and has no present intention of reselling or otherwise disposing of all or a part of such Bank Note. The winning purchaser acknowledges that PFM Financial Advisors LLC

("Municipal Advisor") is relying on the foregoing representation, and based on this representation, this transaction meets the requirements for being a qualifying exception for purposes of MSRB Rule G-34, and Municipal Advisor is excepted and released from the requirement to request a CUSIP assignment on behalf of the Issuer pursuant to MSRB Rule G-34 for the Note.

C. Structure of Financing

Proposers may submit multiple options with differing structures. The guidelines are as follows:

- Overall plan of finance,
- Borrowing rates,
- Fees and expenses,
- Coverage requirements.
- Reserve fund requirements,
- Rating expectations, and
- Marketability of the proposed financing methodology

D. Finance Model

The City has prepared Preliminary Finance Assumptions (Exhibit B) to assist with your response. The outstanding debt is expected to be serviced exclusively through the collection of the (1%) dedicated sales tax. However, the associated use tax can be pledged for additional coverage.

E. Oklahoma Energy Discrimination Act of 2022

On May 7, 2024, Oklahoma County, Oklahoma District Court Judge Sheila D Stinson granted a temporary injunction against the enforcement of the Oklahoma Energy Discrimination Act of 2022 (the "Act"). On September 20, 2024, Judge Stinson subsequently issued an order permanently enjoining enforcement of the Act. The judgment of the Court is expected to be appealed. Based upon the duration of the injunction and/or a subsequent court action reinstating the Act, those submitting a response to the RFP may be required, pursuant to Title 74, Oklahoma Statutes Section 12005, to complete the Certification contained in (Exhibit C) prior to the award of the agreement.

The issuer reserves the right to make an agreement with a listed financial company if permitted under the Act. Therefore, all banking institutions are encouraged to respond to the RFP.

F. Required Forms

The following forms are attached; these forms are for informational purposes only and should not be submitted with your proposal.

The selected proposer(s) will be instructed to complete these forms prior to the execution of the agreement.

V. Proposal Submission Requirements

- A.** Proposals should be prepared in at least size 12 font with a 15-page limit excluding any cover letter.
- B.** The cover letter should not exceed two pages.
- C.** State the legal name of the financial institution or firm, current principal business address, contact person, telephone, and email address.
- D.** Each proposal should address all pertinent areas and be specific. Any conditions should be clearly stated. Refer to Section IV. C. Structure of Financing.
- E.** The failure to disclose substantive terms, conditions, and covenants may be considered cause for the proposer's proposal to be rejected by the Trust.
- F.** The proposer shall examine all proposal documents and shall judge all matters relating to the adequacy of such documents.
- G.** Proposals must be submitted in an electronic PDF document containing searchable text and emailed to waleyd@pfm.com no later than 4:00 p.m. CST on January 14, 2025. Any responses to this RFP received after the stated deadline will not be considered.
- H.** Proposals must contain a statement acknowledging that all addenda to the RFP were considered before submitting their proposal. **The Proposal will not be accepted if the consideration of all addenda is not acknowledged in the proposal.**
- I.** Please refer to the Request For Information, Oklahoma City New NBA Arena Financing Opportunities, dated August 15, 2024, for additional background information regarding the New Arena. (Exhibit A).
- J.** Upon advertising this solicitation, no officer, employee, agent, or representative of the Proposer shall have any contact or discussion, verbal or written, with any representative of the OCPPA or City either directly or indirectly in which the Proposer seeks to influence any representative of the Issuer or the City regarding any matters pertaining to this solicitation.
- K.** General Instructions and Requirements for Proposers:

These instructions, requirements, and any special instructions contained in the Request For Proposal (RFP) document are a part of the terms and conditions of the proposer's proposal

1. **EXAMINATION BY PROPOSERS:** All Proposers must fully examine the specifications, drawings, schedules, special instructions, and these general instructions and requirements before electronically submitting any proposal. Failure to examine is at the Proposer's own risk as the Proposer will be held to the terms, conditions, and requirements therein.
2. **EXCEPTIONS:** Any exceptions to these instructions, requirements, or the RFP packet, must be specified and submitted, as a separate document, with the Proposer's Proposal. Failure to indicate any exceptions will be regarded as full acceptance of the requirements, instructions and RFP packet, and any other proposal documents related to this RFP.
3. **COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAWS:** All Proposers must comply with all applicable federal, state, or local laws and regulations, including Title VI and all provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 42 U.S.C. §§ 2000d, et seq.
4. **SELF-INSURED:** The Contracting Entity is self-insured for its own negligence. The liability of the Contracting Entity for acts of negligence is limited and subject to the Governmental Tort Claims Act, 51 O.S. §§ 151, et seq.
5. **RIGHT TO AUDIT:** The Contracting Entity shall at all times have the right to examine books, papers, and records of the successful Proposer relative to all aspects of the Proposer's proposal and the agreements/contracts awarded as a result of this RFP to assess and confirm proposal and Agreement/Contract compliance. Failure to provide the requested information may result in termination of the Agreement/Contract. This right to audit does not apply to Proposer's other contracts or records not affecting the proposal and Agreement/Contract.
6. **OKLAHOMA OPEN RECORDS ACT AND CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION:** All materials submitted to the Issuer pursuant to this Bid or Proposal potentially become subject to the mandates of the Oklahoma Open Records Act, 51 O.S. § 24A.1. et seq. The purpose of this Act is to ensure and facilitate the public's right to access and review government records so they may efficiently and intelligently exercise their inherent political power. Almost all "records," as that term is defined in the Act, may be disclosed to the public upon request. Except where specific state or federal statutes create a specific and express exemption or confidential privilege, persons who submit information to public bodies have no right to keep this information from public access nor have a reasonable expectation that this information will be kept from public access.

If you believe that any of the information you have submitted to the Issuer pursuant to this Bid or Proposal is exempt or confidential under a specific state or federal statute and, therefore, not subject to public access under the Oklahoma Open Records Act, you must comply with the following:

- a) Place said documents/records in a separate electronic file attachment marked "Confidential." DO NOT label your entire Bid or Proposal as "Confidential" – label only those portions of the Bid or Proposal that you

feel are exempt or are made confidential by state or federal law as “Confidential.”

- b) For each such document for which you are claiming an exemption or a confidential privilege, identify the federal and/or state law that creates said privilege, e.g., for trade secrets, see 21 O.S. § 1732 (Larceny of Trade Secrets) and the Uniform Trade Secrets Act, 78 O.S. § 85 et seq.

Should an Open Records request be presented to the Contracting Entity requesting information you have identified as “Confidential,” you will be responsible for defending your position in the District Court, if needed. If you fail to identify any records submitted as part of your Bid or Proposal as “Confidential,” you agree that said records are not exempt or confidential and are subject to public access. Upon receipt of a request by a third party to review or copy records properly identified as “Confidential,” you will be notified of the request and thereby given an opportunity to immediately enforce and protect your rights by initiating an action in a court of competent jurisdiction.

Should you fail to timely bring an action to enforce your rights, then the requested records will be released by the Contracting Entity based upon its determination regarding the application of the Oklahoma Open Records Act.

VI. EVALUATION OF PROPOSALS – CRITERIA

Proposals will be evaluated based on cost and compliance with the proposed structure and terms as outlined in this RFP. **Banks may submit non-conforming structures, which may be considered if they are advantageous to the Trust.**

The Selection Committee will recommend the proposal(s) that best meets the overall goals and objectives and provides the best economic benefit to the Issuer. Aside from the overall lowest borrowing cost and the requirements listed below, additional criteria for selection will include the following:

- Borrowing Cost
- Fees and Expenses
- Legal security provisions
- Call provisions
- Reporting requirements
- Other criteria as determined by the City

CITY OF OKLAHOMA CITY, OKLAHOMA OKLAHOMA CITY NEW NBA ARENA FINANCING OPPORTUNITIES REQUEST FOR INFORMATION (RFI)

Overview

PFM Financial Advisors LLC (PFM) is requesting information from banks and investment banks regarding financing opportunities for the construction of a New NBA Arena in Oklahoma City. (The City). The information received from respondents will be evaluated to determine the best path forward for financing the construction of the New Arena.

On December 12, 2023, the voters of Oklahoma City approved a (1%) dedicated sales tax to fund the construction of the New Arena, to be collected over a six-year period. Tax collections will begin on April 1, 2028, and end on March 31, 2034.

Respondents are welcome to provide unlimited financing ideas; however, the expectation is to fully pay off any outstanding debt by the end of the dedicated arena sales tax which expires on March 31, 2034. Responses are not limited, but they should include an explanation of coverage requirements, reserve fund requirements, rating expectations, and marketability.

The selection of a bank(s) and/or investment bank(s) will NOT be determined through this RFI process. A separate Request for Proposals (RFP) will be issued at a later date to select a proposal.

Background

Beginning with the 2008-2009 NBA season, the Oklahoma City Thunder (the “Thunder”) of the National Basketball Association has called the City home due to a use license agreement signed by both parties in 2008. In 2023, the initial term of the 2008 use license agreement expired. The Thunder exercised an option to extend the agreement for three years. The City and Thunder leadership have been engaged in discussions concerning the concepts that would allow Thunder and the City to agree to a new long-term use license agreement. In September 2023, representatives of the parties preliminarily agreed to a letter of intent that established a mutual agreement for a new use license agreement that will keep the Thunder in the City beyond 2050. A new state-of-the-art arena is required to receive this long-term commitment from the Thunder. On September 26, 2023, the Oklahoma City Council adopted Ordinance No. 27,420 to levy a temporary dedicated sales tax of one percent (1%) for the special purpose of funding all expenses related in any manner to constructing, establishing, providing, or maintaining an arena facility to be owned by the City, if approved by a majority of the voters. On December 12, 2023, a special election was held regarding the tax levy and passed with 71% approval.

The City and Thunder have set forth material terms and conditions in a Letter of Intent. The following material terms are included:

- Term: Thunder commits to playing its home games in the New Arena for 25 years, commencing upon occupancy of the New Arena. The Thunder further commits to continue playing all its home games at the Paycom Center until the New Arena is completed and prepared for occupancy. The parties intend for the New Arena to be prepared for occupancy no later than the commencement of the 2029-2030 National Basketball Association season.
- Arena: The New Arena will be designed and constructed as a first-class, state-of-the-art facility with at least 750,000 square feet.
- Arena Sales Tax: The city will construct a new arena, to be owned by the City, with the (1%) dedicated sales tax that was approved by the voters on December 12, 2023. This 72-month dedicated sales tax will begin on April 1, 2028, and end on March 31, 2034.
- Budget: The budget and funds available for the New Arena are estimated to be at least \$900,000,000. Said sum consists of projected revenue from the 72-month sales tax, \$78,000,000 of MAPS 4 funds already earmarked for the City's downtown arena, and a \$50,000,000 contribution from the Thunder.
- Agreements: The parties agree to negotiate and execute a use license agreement, food and beverage agreement, and development agreement as soon as practicable.
- Other Terms: The parties agree to address office space, license fees, maintenance terms, facility fees, parking, and other reasonable and necessary ancillary terms in the Agreements listed above.

Finance Model

The City has prepared a preliminary finance model (Exhibit A) to assist with your response. The outstanding debt is expected to be serviced exclusively through the collection of the (1%) dedicated sales tax. However, the associated use tax can be pledged for additional coverage.

The annual Arena Use Tax collected, in addition to the Dedicated Arena Sales Tax, will be pledged to the repayment of the debt. It is anticipated that the sales tax will be sufficient to repay the debt, therefore the use tax will not be needed for debt service purposes.
