Concurrence with the Oklahoma City Water Utilities Trust in approving Change Order No. 1 with Hydro Resources - Mid Continent, Inc., Project TW-0009-R, Well 27 Rehabilitation-Test Hole, Tinker Air Force Base, decrease of \$65,000. Ward 4.

Location:

Tinker Air Force Base

Justification:

It is necessary to deduct pay items to match the actual field quantities. Additional contract time was required due to the addition of work required to complete construction.

Background:

Well 27 was built in 1953 and has reached the end of its service life. This project is to drill a test hole to obtain the design parameters for the permanent replacement of Well 27. Since no bids were received on January 3, 2024, this project was re-advertised with modifications to allow successful bidding.

Change Order No. 1 reduces the number of soil samples. The original contract required six soil samples, one from each water zone in the borehole. Since there were only four zones, only four tests were required. Sixty calendar days were added to the contract to allow for site restoration and seeding to comply with Tinker Air Force Base requirements.
