## The City of OKLAHOMA CITY

Joint Resolution with the Oklahoma City Municipal Facilities Authority authorizing the Risk Manager and the Trust's legal counsel not to appeal and to comply with the Order of the Workers' Compensation Commission Claim No. CM3-2022-04005R, styled: *Kyle Patterson, Claimant vs. The City of Oklahoma City, Respondent*, an Own Risk Carrier, and authorizing payment to the Claimant of permanent partial disability benefits, attorney fees, less an assessment for the Multiple Injury Trust Fund; authorizing payment of costs and fees for the Respondent.

### **Background:**

The Claimant, Kyle Patterson is a 34-year-old and is a 6-year employee of The City of Oklahoma City. At the time of the injury he was assigned to the Fire Department as a Corporal and retired from the City on January 18, 2023.

Claimant sustained an undisputed accidental injury on January 17, 2022 to his low back and right hip. Claimant required surgery to his right hip on September 22, 2022.

Claimant was evaluated by Dr. Lance E Rosson on behalf of his attorney and found to have the following permanent partial impairment: low back 25%, right hip 26%. Claimant was also evaluated by Dr. William Jones MD on behalf of the City and found to have the following permanent partial impairment: low back 4%, right hip 5%.

On September 6, 2023, Judge Molly Lawyer, of the Workers' Compensation Commission, awarded Claimant the following permanent partial disability: low back 14%, right hip 18% entitling Claimant to 115.20 weeks of compensation at \$360 per week, totaling \$41,472, of which 26 weeks have accrued and shall be paid in a lump sum of \$9,360.

The settlement further calls for a 3% assessment of the PPD award in the sum of \$1,244.16 to be deducted and paid on behalf of the claimant for the Multiple Injury Trust Fund Tax, making the lump sum award \$40,227.84. The Commission further ordered \$8,294.40 or 20% of the PPD award be deducted from the award and paid in a lump sum to Claimant's attorney as a fair and reasonable fee. In addition, the City will pay Court costs \$140, a Special Occupational Health and Safety Tax Fund, representing .75% of the permanent partial disability award in the sum of \$311.04 and the Workers' Compensation Administration Fund, representing 2% of the permanent partial disability award in the sum of \$829.44.
