Memorandum of Understanding with the Oklahoma City-County Board of Health, acting through the Oklahoma City-County Health Department, to present the "Health at School" program at one or more recreation centers within the Oklahoma City park system, retroactive to June 1, 2024 through May 31, 2025.

Location:

One or more recreation centers within the Oklahoma City park system

Background:

The mission of the Oklahoma City-County Health Department ("OCCHD") is to protect health, promote wellness, prevent disease, and partner in the community. OCCHD and The City of Oklahoma City ("City") wish to enter into this memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") to offer the Health at School program ("Program") at one or more agreed-upon locations within the City's park system.

The Program will consist of summer enrichment and health programming, as well as parenting and family-support services. Youth-oriented elements of the Program will be open to elementary- and middle-school-aged children who participate at the City's recreation centers. Other Program elements will be open to adult residents of Oklahoma City. Program elements will include social-emotional learning, exercise and fitness classes, leadership training, parenting-skills training, nutrition-education sessions, and access to social services. OCCHD and the City will mutually agree on the dates, times, and locations for implementing the Program.

OCCHD will provide all instructors, supplies, and materials needed to implement the Program. The City will coordinate OCCHD's access to and use of the site(s) and provide ancillary staff support for Program activities. Each party will pay its own Program-related costs. Either party may terminate the MOU under certain circumstances. Upon City approval, the MOU will be retroactively effective from June 1, 2024, through May 31, 2025. With mutual consent, the MOU may be renewed for one year.
