Concurrence with the Oklahoma City Water Utilities Trust in ratifying and approving Addendum No. 1; awarding a contract to Downey Contracting, LLC, Project WC-0863-2, Balancing Tank Replacement, Atoka Pipeline Pump Stations, Coalgate and Macomb, \$22,210,769; and approving the contract and bonds.

Location:

Atoka Pipeline Pump Stations, Coalgate and Macomb, Oklahoma

Background:

This project provides for the replacement of two balancing tanks along the Atoka Pipeline that were built in 1964. The current tanks are steel and the new tanks will be concrete. Each pump station along the Atoka pipeline is served by a five-million-gallon tank. The existing steel tanks are original to the pipeline from 1964 and need to be replaced. The tanks at Stonewall, Ada, and Konawa pump stations were replaced in an earlier phase. This project will replace the existing tanks at Coalgate and Macomb with new concrete tanks.

The addendum was required to modify and clarify plans and specifications, and answer questions from potential bidders. The addendum modifications take precedence over the original plans and specifications.
