<p>Title of Item: An Ordinance amending the Oklahoma City Municipal Code, 2020, relating to Food Sales from Vehicles in the Public Right-of-Way; amending Chapter 21 – Food and Beverages, by amending Article VIII – Food Sales from Vehicles, Division I - Generally, Section 21-395 - Restrictions on food sales from vehicles; and amending Chapter 32 – Motor Vehicles and Traffic, by amending Article II- Administration and Enforcement, Division 4 – Impoundment of Vehicles, by enacting a new Section 32-104.2 - Impoundment of food sales vehicle.</p>

<p>Description of Impact</p>	
<p>To amend an existing ordinance which establishes restrictions on food sales from vehicles by adding a restriction prohibiting food sales vehicles from stopping temporarily to sell or distribute food or beverages on the public-right of way in the area commonly known as “Bricktown” between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. The ordinance amendment further creates a Class “a” offense and authorizes the impoundment of the food sales vehicle.</p>
