Approve an allocation of Unlisted General Obligation Bond Funds from Proposition 3 of the 2017 General Obligation Bond Authorization in the amount of \$100,000 to unlisted Project TC-0526, portable driver feedback signs and speed cushions. Wards 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8.

Background:

This project and allocation request will utilize Unlisted General Obligation Bond Funds from Proposition 3 of the 2017 General Obligation Bond Authorization and allow for the Traffic Services division of the Public Works Department to replace some of its aging driver speed feedback signs with newer models. The signs are to be used primarily in support of the City's Alternative Speed Abatement Program (ASAP) as a means to remind drivers of their social contract to obey posted speed limits and to offer a "try-it-before-you-buy-it" option for neighborhoods considering the purchase of such signs for installation within their neighborhoods under the terms of ASAP. Each feedback sign is estimated to cost \$4,600.

Additionally, the purchase of prefabricated speed cushions is also requested. The speed cushions are to be used in a similar "try-it-before-you-buy-it" means to address speed-related traffic issues within residential areas. Speed cushions are typically installed in pairs. Each pair is estimated to cost \$10,000. Driver speed feedback signs and speed cushions are two of four program features within the ASAP. Where deployed, staff will conduct before and after traffic speed and volume studies to evaluate their both their immediate and long-term effectiveness.

This project is expected to begin construction in Spring 2025 and be completed in Summer 2025.
