

RESOLUTION DECLARING 2014 AIRBUS AS350 B3E HELICOPTER OBSOLETE AND SURPLUS TO THE NEEDS OF THE CITY OF OKLAHOMA CITY, AND AUTHORIZING DISPOSAL OF SAID USED EQUIPMENT THROUGH A BROKER SERVICE.

WHEREAS, the Oklahoma City Police Department has identified 2014 Airbus AS350 B3e Helicopter as obsolete and surplus to the needs of the City and would like to dispose of the surplus equipment by means of a broker service; and

WHEREAS, the unit is reaching a 12-year time frame, that will require the Helicopter Technicians to do a full overhaul; and

WHEREAS, This will require an estimated 12 months of maintenance, and this will put the Helicopter out of commission; and

WHEREAS, the sale price could exceed \$50,000; and

WHEREAS, the Purchasing policies and procedures require staff to obtain Council/Trust approval prior to selling surplus property with a value exceeding \$50,000; and

WHEREAS, revenues collected from the sale of this surplus equipment will be returned to the fund from which the equipment was originally purchased; and

WHEREAS, staff requests Council declare the obsolete equipment as surplus and authorize disposal through a broker service.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of The Oklahoma City Oklahoma City that they do hereby declare 2014 Airbus AS350 B3e Helicopter obsolete and surplus to the needs of the City of Oklahoma City, and authorizing disposal of said used equipment through a broker service.
