Concurrence with the Oklahoma City Water Utilities Trust in adopting a Resolution rescinding the Final Acceptance of Project WT-0159, Redundancy and Resiliency Improvements for Water Treatment and Storage, Draper Water Treatment Plant, amending Project WT-0159 to approve the claim in the amount of \$1,787,224.54, and thereupon approving Final Acceptance of Project WT-0159, as amended, and reaffirming the maintenance bond effective date as July 16, 2024. Ward 4.

Location:

Draper Water Treatment Plant

Background:

This project consisted of various improvements to strengthen the redundancy and resiliency for water treatment and storage at the Draper Water Treatment Plant. These improvements included the addition of two new five-million-gallon clearwells, a new filtered water flume to convey filtered water from the existing filter building to the new clearwells, improvements to the plant water loop system, and replacement of the plant ammonia piping system.

The project has been constructed in accordance with the specifications and was final accepted on July 16, 2024.

This Resolution amends the final claim amount to reconcile the project. The final pay application was not processed due to a clerical error. The final claim was accepted in the amount of \$2,452,792.58 and should be amended to \$1,787,224.54.

Travelers Casualty and Surety Company of America is the surety company for the two-year maintenance bond. Bond No. 106948577 will remain in effect until the contractor and surety have fulfilled all responsibilities under the maintenance bond.
