Joint Resolution with the Oklahoma City Municipal Facilities Authority authorizing the Director of Risk Management and the Trust's legal counsel to enter into a Joint Petition Settlement of the Workers' Compensation Commission Claim No. CM3-2022-02032N styled: *Kevin Miller, Claimant vs. The City of Oklahoma City, Respondent*, an Own Risk Carrier, and further authorizing the Municipal Counselor to assist said counsel in the rendition of said Joint Petition Settlement to Judgment as authorized by 85 O.S. §346, 62 O.S. §§365.1 *et seq.* and Article 10, Section 28 of the Oklahoma Constitution.

Background:

The Claimant, Kevin Miller is 56 years old and a 29-year employee of The City of Oklahoma City. At the time of the injury he was assigned to the Police Department as a Sergeant and retired from the City as of January 20, 2023.

Claimant sustained an undisputed accidental injury on January 17, 2022 to his left shoulder, chest, binaural hearing loss, neck, head, right hand, left hand, speech, and psychological overlay. The Claimant required surgery to his left shoulder on March 10, 2022 and surgery to the right and left hand on July 14, 2022.

Claimant was evaluated by Dr. Lance E. Rosson on behalf of his attorney and found to have the following permanent partial impairment: 30% left shoulder, 30% left arm, 28% neck, 19% head, 39% right hand, 39% left hand, 10% speech, and 10% psychological overlay. The Claimant was also evaluated by Dr. William D. Jones on behalf of the City and found to have the following permanent partial impairment: 6% left shoulder, 0% left arm, 2% neck, 11% head, 5% right hand, 5% left hand, 6% speech, and 5% psychological overlay.

The negotiated Joint Petition Settlement calls for a PPD award of \$143,964 for the following permanent partial disability: 18% left shoulder, 15% chest, 15% binaural hearing loss, 8% neck, 22% head, 15% right hand, 15% left hand, 8% speech, 8% psychological overlay. The settlement includes additional payments of \$5000 for vocational retraining and \$1,036 for additional consideration, for a total award of \$150,000.

The settlement further calls for a 3% assessment of the PPD award, less the payment of the additional payment amounts, in the sum of \$4,318.92 be deducted and paid on behalf of the claimant for the Multiple Injury Trust Fund Tax, making the lump sum award, including the

additional payments, \$145,681.08. The settlement further calls for \$30,000 to be deducted from the PPD award and paid in a lump sum to the Claimant's attorney as a fair and reasonable fee. In addition, the City will pay Court costs \$140, a Special Occupational and Safety Fund tax representing .75% of the permanent partial disability award, including the additional payments, shall be paid in the sum of \$1,125 and the Workers' Compensation Administration Fund, representing 2% of the permanent partial disability award, less the additional payments, shall be paid in the sum of \$2,879.28.
