Concurrence with the Oklahoma City Water Utilities Trust in adopting a Resolution ratifying the actions of the General Manager in declaring an emergency; approving the bidding documents, approving Addendum No. 1, and awarding a contract to Urban Contractors, LLC, Project SE-0059, Emergency Sanitary Sewer Aerial Creek Crossing Replacement, Windover Drive and Coachlight Drive, \$208,040; ratifying issuance of an emergency work order; and approving the contract and bonds.

Location:

Windover Drive and Coachlight Drive (Edmond)

Justification:

This addendum was required to clarify the plans and specifications and answer questions from potential bidders. This addendum modification takes precedence over the original plans and specifications.

Background:

This emergency project is required to replace a collapsing 8-inch sanitary sewer pipe. The necessary repairs include the installation of a new sewer main, casing pipe, and two concrete piers. The repairs were beyond the ability of the Utilities Department. It is in the best interest of the public health, safety, and welfare that repairs be completed timely to restore the operational capacity in the area.
