Memorandum of Understanding with Youth on Course for a youth participation partnership with The City of Oklahoma City Golf Courses, March 17, 2025 through March 16, 2028. Wards 2, 4, 5 and 7.

Background:

Youth on Course is a non-profit organization established in 2006 whose goal is to break down financial barriers by creating partnerships with public and private golf courses to allow youth the opportunity to play the game of golf for a very low cost. In January 2025, Youth on Course approached City Staff and the Oklahoma City Golf Commission with a proposal to grow the game of golf in Oklahoma City by joining their national program and offering the Youth on Course round rate to all youth golfers, regardless of any financial barriers to access.

Youth on Course will subsidize the Oklahoma City Golf System Junior golf round at \$25 per round. In exchange, youth members of their organization can play golf at any Oklahoma City public golf course for no additional cost. This program would be open to all children under the age of nineteen (19) by enrolling in an annual Youth on Course membership. Youth on Course memberships range from \$25 to \$40 per year, and they offer zero cost memberships for those who can show a need.

The Golf Commission formally recommended this youth participation partnership on March 5, 2025. The Golf Commission believes this partnership will open new avenues for youth in the City's metropolitan area to access the Oklahoma City Golf System at no cost while maintaining golf system revenues.

Revenue:

The estimated annual increase is approximately \$25,000.
