## Attachment B - Sign Code Changes since January 11, 2022 draft code

Since the ordinance draft (dated January 11, 2022) that was reviewed and recommended by the design review committees and commissions, the ordinance text has been updated to address the specific conditions recommended by Arts Commission, suggestions discussed by the Planning Commission Development Review Committee, and additional comments received by Planning staff from internal and external stakeholders. These changes are summarized below.

59-16119	Definitions	Changed the definition of "sign height" to clarify that the existing definition is just for freestanding signs, and that lowest to highest is for attached signs. Changed the definition of murals to read: One-of-a-kind visual depictions and/or works of art or licensed reproductions of original works of art including, but not limited to, mosaic, painting, or graphic art techniques that are applied, painted, implanted, or placed directly onto the exterior of any structure. This definition is not intended to discourage the use of new paint and printing technologies. [Reference: see Section 59-16112 of this Code. Changed as follows: Canopy Sign: An attached <del>accessory s</del> ign painted on or attached to the vertical side of, or erected on the roof surface of, a canopy or awning. Combination sign: A single attached <del>accessory</del> sign incorporating any combination of the features of the projecting, parapet wall, canopy, marquee, and wall signs. Marquee Sign: An attached <del>accessory</del> sign painted on or attached to the vertical side of, or erected on the roof surface of, a marquee.

Parapet wall sign: Attached accessory sign erected on the top surface of a parapet.
Roof sign, Type B: attached accessory sign erected on a vertical framework supported by and located immediately and entirely over the roof of a building
Wall Sign: An attached accessory sign painted on or attached to the wall or surface of a building or display surface which is parallel to the supporting surface. A sign attached to a wall or fence located on the boundary of a parcel shall be regulated as a ground sign.
