

SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE EMERGENCY SOLUTIONS GRANT COVID AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF OKLAHOMA CITY AND NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES ORGANIZATION, INC. TO EXTEND THE TERM OF THE AGREEMENT FROM SEPTEMBER 30, 2022 TO SEPTEMBER 30, 2023 AND RECAPTURE \$41,324.90 IN FUNDS FROM NSO.

This Second Amendment revises Section 2 and Section 3 of the Agreement to extend its term; revises Attachments “A” and “B to recapture \$41,324.90 in funds allocated for Rapid Rehousing/TBRA/Services; and leaves intact all other provisions of the initial Agreement approved by the City Council on August 4, 2020, and the First Amendment approved by the City Council on March 16, 2021. The amended provisions now read as follows:

2. Term of Agreement

The term of this Agreement shall be from March 15, 2020 to September 30, 2023.

3. Funding

In exchange for the services to be provided under this Agreement, CITY shall allocate to PROVIDER such ESG-CV funds as such funds become available from HUD and from no other source. Such compensation to PROVIDER shall not exceed the amount specified in Schedule "B" attached hereto and incorporated as a part hereof by reference. PROVIDER agrees to make expenditures in accordance with Attachments “A” and “B”. It is expressly agreed and understood by CITY and PROVIDER that this Agreement shall not provide for compensation for work performed beyond September 30, 2023, the end of term of this Agreement. All reimbursement claims must be submitted to CITY by December 31, 2023. No claims for reimbursement shall be accepted after December 31, 2023.
