

FOURTH AMENDMENT TO THE EMERGENCY SOLUTIONS GRANT COVID PROGRAM AGREEMENT

This Fourth Amendment to the Emergency Solutions Grant COVID Program Agreement with Homeless Alliance is to increase funding, as more specifically described in Attachments "A" and "B" to this Agreement and leaves intact all other provisions of the initial Emergency Solutions Grant Program Agreement approved by City Council on August 4, 2020, as well as the First Amendment to the Emergency Solutions Grant Covid Agreement approved by City Council on March 16, 2021, The Second Amendment to the Emergency Solutions Grant Covid Program Agreement with Homeless Alliance approved by Council on January 4, 2022, and The Third Amendment to the Emergency Solutions Grant Covid Program Agreement with Homeless Alliance on May 24, 2022.

- 1) This Fourth Amendment increases funding by \$334,381.07 for a total contract amount of \$2,701,437.07, with allocations as follows:
 - a) \$314,381.07 of additional funds are added to the Rapid Re-Housing/TBRA/Services category;
 - b) \$20,000 of additional funds are added to the Street Outreach category; and
 - c) \$85,000 of existing funds are transferred from Emergency Shelter category to the Rapid Re-Housing/TBRA/Services category.
- 2) Changes to budget category amounts may be authorized as requested by Homeless Alliance, Inc. in writing and approved by the City's Project Manager, provided that the total ESG-CV budget of \$2,701,437.07 shall not be exceeded.

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT SERVICE

Project Description:

This project will fund Homeless Prevention, Rapid Re-Housing, Street Outreach, Temporary Emergency Shelter, Day Shelter and Street Outreach Activities as allowed by United States Department of Housing and Urban Development Notice CPD-21-08 dated July 19, 2021.

Number of persons to be served: Approximately 3,000 individuals

CITY'S ALLOCATION, RATE OF DRAWDOWN

City's Allocation: \$2,701,437.07

Rate of Drawdown: Funds for reimbursable expenses shall be drawn down at least quarterly.

Funds expended through the Street Outreach, Homelessness Prevention, Rapid Re-Housing, Temporary Emergency Shelter and Emergency Shelter categories must be expended by September 30, 2023. HMIS funds must be expended prior to December 31, 2023.
