Title of Item: Ordinance to be introduced and adopted with emergency, relating to Food and Beverages, amending Chapter 21 of the Oklahoma City Municipal Code, 2020, by amending Article III, Division 2, Section 21-91, Special event food license, Section 21-92, License fees and penalty, Section 21-93, Exemptions and Chapter 60, Article VIII, Special events, Section 60-21-26 and Section 60-21-56, Food sale, vehicle.

Originating Department: Development Services

Description of Impact

Effective July 1, 2022, the Oklahoma City-County Health Department (OCCHD) gave notice of their intent to terminate the Agreement with The City of Oklahoma City for inspection services for special events and certain other licenses. The Contract was terminated pursuant to the terms of the Agreement that required a 30-day written notice to terminate by either party. As a result of this contract termination, some licenses that previously required a health inspection before issuance were delayed while City staff worked to develop a new license-processing method. OCCHD also requested certain other ordinances be changed to eliminate their involvement with other inspections that result in licenses being issued by the City.

This proposed ordinance amendment would require vendors to register with the City prior to the start of any special event. This registration will allow vendors to apply online prior to the event. The vendor is still required to comply with all OCCHD guidelines, which includes inspection by OCCHD.


