Agricultural Use Agreement with Davis Mayberry for hay cultivation at Route 66 Park, 9901 NW 23rd Street; South Lakes Park, 4210 SW 119th Street; and Lone Oak Park, 4220 NW 164th Street, revenue of \$400, September 27, 2022 through November 15, 2022. Wards 1, 3 and 8.

Location:

Route 66 Park, 9901 Northwest 23rd Street; South Lakes Park, 4210 Southwest 119th Street; and Lone Oak Park, 4220 Northwest 164th Street

Background:

The City of Oklahoma City (City) owns the park locations described above (collectively, the Sites), which all include areas of open greenspace with no park infrastructure. Davis Mayberry (Permittee) requested this Agricultural Use Agreement (Agreement) for short-term hay cultivation at designated areas within the Sites. Permittee's interim use of the Sites would benefit the City by reducing maintenance costs and limiting fire danger.

Under the Agreement, Permittee can harvest and keep one cut of hay from each of the Sites for his personal use; he may not sell the hay or use it for any commercial purpose. As consideration, he will pay the City \$400. All activities under the Agreement will be at Permittee's expense. The Agreement will be effective through November 15, 2022, or until Permittee completes the one hay harvest at each of the Sites, whichever is first. The City may terminate the Agreement, without cause, upon written notice to Permittee.

Permittee must provide required insurance and indemnification; protect City property; and comply with applicable laws, rules, and policies. Permittee and his adult relatives, employees, or associates working at the Sites must also provide signed releases. No minors may work at the Sites under this Agreement.
