Resolution authorizing the submission of an application for 2022 Continuum of Care Federal grant funds to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, and accepting the recommendations of the Continuum of Care Board related to the application, to include: Homeless Alliance, Inc. (Coordinated Entry Renewal) \$21,400; Homeless Alliance, Inc. (Supportive Housing Renewal), \$600,000; Community Enhancement Corp. (Supportive Housing Renewal), \$48,085; Hope Community Services, (Supportive Housing Renewal), \$361,803; Hope Community Services, (Supportive Housing Renewal), \$192,460; City Care, Inc. Background:

An Open Solicitation was issued on August 11, 2022, that sought proposals from non-profit agencies willing to participate in the response to the Notification of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the 2022 Continuum of Care grant. Eighteen (18) proposals were received on August 30, 2022.

The Continuum of Care Board met on September 7, 2022 and completed a review and evaluation of all proposals. The Continuum of Care Board unanimously recommended the following agencies and allocation amounts for inclusion in the application:
